

Education and Professional Development Program Highlights

- K-State Olathe academic programs (credit bearing)
 - Interim Associate Dean Dr. Jackie Spears was named interim associate dean for academic affairs at K-State Olathe. She oversees and guides the undergraduate and graduate programs at the campus and also directs enrollment efforts. Dr. Spears follows Dr. Janice Barrow who served in this position for three years.
 - Professional Science Master's (PSM) Program Update –The PSM program, which launched in the fall of 2016, now has 22 active students. The first three students earned their master's degree this spring and summer, and 24 graduate certificates have been awarded. Work is underway to refine course clusters related to animal health and food safety and security in order to assist with advising students as well as to add new courses for PSM students.
 - New Programs Working with Kansas State University partners, the campus launched a hospitality
 management undergraduate degree completion program this summer. The first five students began
 coursework this fall. Discussions also are underway with colleges and departments, as part of the K-State in KC
 task force, to plan for other new offerings.
 - Current Enrollment During Spring 2018, 179* students were taking 662 hours in all programs (*JCERT and non-JCERT). This fall, 134* students are enrolled in Olathe-specific courses for 480 credit hours. The chart below specifically reflects Olathe-only headcounts and enrollments in JCERT-related programs as of October 2018.

Research:

- Sensory and Consumer Research Center The K-State Emoji Scale research continues with a focus on promoting the scale and increasing application of use. The Center's team will be presenting at the Society of Sensory Professionals Conference to industry partners (upon request), and also has published in *Food Quality & Preference*. In addition, the group is currently comparing adult responses and considering applicability across cultures. Research is planned for January 2019 with an industry partner and the EWHA Womans University in Seoul, Korea.
- Applied Food Science and Safety Dr. Londa Nwadike, a joint appointment between Kansas and Missouri Extension and Research, organized food safety-related educational events for produce growers and farmers market vendors across Kansas and Missouri, reaching more than 700 stakeholders. She was the Principal Investigator on grants that received funding between Oct 1, 2017 and Sept 30, 2018, totaling \$314,296 (in Kansas and KS/MO) and \$255,980 (in Missouri).
- Post Harvest Research Dr. Eleni Pliakoni, along with collaborators, received a grant from the U.S. Agency for International Development, U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Horticulture Innovation Lab in the University of California Davis, titled: "Capacity Building on Produce Postharvest Management in Tanzania" (\$500,000). Dr. Pliakoni's role is focused on reviewing postharvest courses in existing Bachelor of Science Horticulture and Master of Science Crop Science programs and developing a new curriculum for a Master of Science in Horticulture for the Sokoine University of Agriculture in Tanzania. Dr. Pliakoni, along with Dr. Nwadike, worked collaboratively with Dr. V. Tirinetta and were awarded a grant titled, "Effective Packing Practices to Control Postharvest Diseases in Small Fruit Crops" (\$70,086).
- Food Science Research Dr. Sara Gragg co-authored five peer-reviewed journal articles in the area of food safety and food security in 2018. She and Dr. Justin Kastner co-advised Danny Unruh who became the first food science Ph.D. student to complete a research dissertation at the Olathe campus.
- 1Data The vision for 1DATA is to bring together human and animal health data, pre-clinical trial data and medidata to develop a cohesive and structured environment to collect and disseminate information, which will improve the quality of animal and human health through refined and enhanced collaborative research and education. Multiple projects are underway utilizing the 1Data platform. Currently, the 1Data team is advancing a multi-pronged approach toward developing a decision support tool at the point of care, geared toward ending the rare disease diagnostic odyssey. This approach is utilizing information from multiple sources in 1Data and is in partnership with iShare Medical.

Engagement:

- K-12 Outreach:
 - Impact Between Aug. 2017 and Aug. 2018, more than 7,500 students were impacted at 70 events in an
 effort to enhance STEM education experiences for teachers and students in grades K-12. The efforts are
 focused on filling the workforce pipeline for in-demand careers in Greater Kansas City and beyond.
 - College Advising Corps A Kauffman grant (\$175,000) was secured to support the ongoing efforts of the College Advising Corps to help first-generation and underserved students progress to college. Laura Loyacona, director of education and community engagement, led the effort and collaborated with K-State's New Student Services team to submit the grant proposal.
 - STEM Camps for Middle School Students –This summer, middle school students were invited to spend a week
 at K-State's Olathe campus learning food science and animal health. The camps were week-long and
 supported math and science through fun, hands-on learning and activities. Scholarships were awarded to
 Johnson County students, STEM scholars, who continue to receive support to ensure they reach college.

Professional development programs (non-credit bearing)

- Professional development opportunities continue to be expanded at K-State Olathe. Feedback shows that
 participants consider programming to be high quality with evaluations consistently scoring above 4.25 on a 5point scale. Attendance in programming:
 - **2017 = 546**
 - 2018 (actuals-to-date) = 795
 - 2019 projection = 1,100
- Regulatory Affairs Seminars K-State Olathe hosted the fifth seminar designed to connect professionals in the
 animal health industry to officials at federal regulatory agencies. On Sept. 19, more than 60 participants learned
 about antibiotic resistance and management.
- Animal Health Industry Insights: Trends and Career Pathways On October 23, more than 80 participants
 heard from leaders in the industry, including speakers from Ceva, Bayer, Elanco and others, about changes and
 opportunities in the growing animal health industry. This event was in collaboration with K-State's Master of
 Agribusiness program.
- One Health Day 2018

 Kansas City One Health Day will be held on Nov. 1 at the Olathe campus. Attendees will
 learn about how a collaborative approach to human, animal and environmental health may help society
 outsmart antibiotic resistance. The event is co-hosted with BioNexus KC and BioKansas.
- SciFlix A JCERT partners' event will be held on Nov. 16. K-State Olathe and KU Edwards, along with the
 Museum at Prairiefire, will host a screening of the movie *Outbreak* followed by a panel discussion with Drs. Jerry
 and Nancy Jaax, scientists and K-State alumni featured in the film. The movie will be shown at Cinetopia with the
 panel and a reception to follow at the Prairiefire Museum.
- K-State and Partner Programs and Events K-State Olathe has hosted a variety of professional development workshops, planning meetings and events, which totaled 26,004 attendees in 2017. Our partners continue to increase usage of the campus in 2018. The table below provides event counts.

Campus Updates

Personnel Update

• **Dr. Gary Anderson** joined the campus team while maintaining his academic home in the Department of Diagnostic Medicine and Pathobiology in K-State's College of Veterinary Medicine. He will work with academic-industry programs centered around animal health with an emphasis on laboratory operations and applied research.

Financial Highlights

FY 2018: The campus ended the fiscal year with a net deficit in K-State funds. This was driven by two primary factors: a budget reduction from the university of approximately \$300,000 and a two-year commitment to two positions, one in animal health and one for community engagement around K-12 STEM outreach to first generation and minority students. On more positive fiscal notes, JCERT revenue exceeded the budget, tuition revenue was 20% over projections, and professional development income was strong and continues to grow. Finally, we are beginning to expend the deferred maintenance reserve as the building is now seven years old and we are taking steps to maintain the building.

FY 2019: The first quarter of the fiscal year is trending to budget. We expect revenue to meet expectations. This is the second year of an aggressive budget as we have invested in new faculty positions and expect programs to grow, yet are conservative in income projections. We continue to increase both credit and non-credit programming and expect revenue will grow in both areas.
